For sure, thanks to the 2019, 2020 and 2021 vintages, all of which are better than good, there now exists an embarrassment of riches for Barolo-lovers. It may not be the best of Barolo times, but in this epoch of climate change, well...at the very least, it's pretty good times. Enjoy!

Fortemasso.

Fortemasso 2020 Barolo Castelletto 95

Red-ruby. Perfumed, sappy and fresh aromas of redcurrant, flowers and minerals. Intense and highpitched, with a penetrating core of sweet spices complementing the red and dark fruit flavours. Finishes very long and nicely tapered, with substantial, but polished tannins. Drinking window: 2028-2039.

Fortemasso 2017 Barolo Castelletto Riserva 93

Vivid red-ruby with a garnet rim. Slightly reticent on the nose and in the mouth, offering mostly straightforward and clean, violet and red fruit nuances. The long rising close showcases polished tannins and very good size, not to mention inviting violet lift. The hot 2017 vintage aromatically compressed most of the wines, and you get that effect here to a degree, but this is a rather successful 2017 wine. Well done. Drinking window: 2027-2037.
